



1) Title of the Practice: Admission free of cost to ST/SC/VJNT/OBC/Minorities.

Introduction:

The college is run by Shri. Shivaji Education Society, Amravati founded by Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh, the former central Agriculture Minister of India.
