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1. INTRODUCTION

Shri Shivaji Education Society, Amravati

Dr. Panjabrao alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh, one of the greatest educationist, agriculturist and reformist founded this society in 1931 and started its work through Shri. Shivaji Maratha High School. It aimed at educating and upbringing the poor rural students who were far away from the field of education. The society succeeded tremendously in its aim and to-day we have educational institutes at cities as well as in interior areas, offering courses in Agriculture, Commerce, Arts, Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Law, Management, Medicine, Physical Education, Science and Information Technology. Shri. Shivaji Education Society is the biggest Education Society in the central India., running colleges and Training Centers, Schools and Kindergartens, Hostels ,numerous workshops, extension services, printing press, Gymnasia , Health Club and a host of other facilities totaling about 132 in the service of the community at large, along with a 150 bed Hospital and Medical Research Center.

Our society's service is rewarded for its distinguished work and devotion. In the year 1993-94, the Govt. of Maharashtra awarded the "Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Dalit Mitra Award." In the year 1999-2000, the society was awarded the Gadge Maharaj Memorial Award. On 5 Sept. 2000, the Govt. of Maharashtra declared Shri. Shivaji Education Society as the best administered society in the state and bestowed upon it a cash reward of Rs. One Lakh. The Govt. of Maharashtra has duly recognized society's contribution in the field of education and cultural advancement from time to time.

Dr. Gopalrao Khedkar Mahavidyalaya Gadegaon (Telhara)

Dr. Gopalrao Khedkar Mahavidyalaya Gadegaon (Telhara) came into being in 1969 with its specific goals and objectives. It aimed at educating and upbringing the poor, backward and rural students scattering everywhere in remote rural areas around Telhara-Town. Residents of Telhara such as Mr. Atmaramji Patil Dhole, Mr. Bhikaji Tayade, Mr. Tulsiramji Agrawal, Mr. Dhansukdasji Thanvi, Mr. Deshmukh saheb and even the farmers had rendered notable services by donating labours, finance and valuable times for the establishment of the institution.

Initially, the college was known as Shri. Shivaji Arts and Commerce Mahavidyalaya. Keeping in mind the remarkable social work in this area of late Honorable Dr. Gopalrao alias Abasaheb Khedkar, the Rural Development Minister, Govt. of Maharashtra, the college was re-named as Dr. Gopalrao Khedkar Mahavidyalaya, Gadegaon (Telhara) as a respect to his social work. The Dharmal Sansthan of Gadegaon gave its land on leize to Shri. Shivaji Education Society. Since then, the name, Gadegaon was included with the name of the college.



Later, in the year 1975 Junior College and in 1992 H.S.V.C. had added to the college. The college, which was earlier started in a small accommodation, now has two-storied buildings for administrative and teaching purposes. There are separate Home Economics Laboratory, H.S.V.C. workshop building and administrative library. Computer Lab, Science Lab, Language Lab, Auditorial Hall, Women Hostel, Network Research centre, Common Girls Room, ICT room, Reading Room, Servising Centre. The college has other amenities such as a beautiful Green Garden, dam, water harvesting, spacious playground for games and sports, Tube-well and Drinking water Tank, Cycle Stand etc. The college set up Dr. Panjabral alias Bahusaheb Deshmush Memorial amid the garden.

There are three faculties i.e. Arts, Commerce, Science & Post Graducation in Marathi and Political Science M.Com with optional subjects. The college offers education from the 11th standard to the Post Graduate level in these faculties. There is vocational course like H.S.V.C. too. Students from all walks of life especially from rural areas admit to the college with the goal to obtain quality education from the competent teachers. All teachers are well versed in knowledge and information. They are ever ardent to work for the mission of the college. There are extension activities undertaken through N.S.S., N.C.C. departments. Physical Education and Cultural Activities Committee work for alround development of students. The college also runs career orientation programme such as E-commerce, Development of communication skills and Tax, Planning, Management and Human Rights Certificate Course. The college library has the largest stock of the oldest as well as the most recent books on all subjects taught in the college and issued a text and reference book. The competent teaching / non-teaching staff devotedly discharge their duties under an efficient administrator and Principal Dr. G. J. Dhole. The college celebrated its Golden Jubilee year during the session 2018-19.

Special Instruction Related to Fees:

- 1) In case of any change in the prescribed fees, the same will be notified as when received from the Board/University/Government.
- 2) University Examination fees and Practical and Laboratory fee will be according to university rules. 11
- 3) Students of Arts, Commerce and Science who have opted for the subjects with laboratory work / practical / Computer shall have to pay the fee.
- 4) Migration fee will be according to University rules.
- 5) Students must produce his / her Identity Card and the receipt of the amount paid at the time of getting the refund of excess fees, deposits or any other refundable amount.
- 4. Admission Procedure and Guidelines (Common for all Faculties)
 Admission as per merit and other norms as laid down by the University, the Govt. of
 Maharashtra from time to time. Parents/students are required to go through the guidelines
 and admission notices put up on the college Notice Board before seeking admission in
 the college.
 - 1) Application on the prescribed form must be accompanied by two recent passport size photographs and copies of the following documents duly attested by gazetted officer or an approved teacher of the concerned University.
 - I) School/college original leaving certificate, (T.C.), and two attested Xerox copies.
 - II) Statement of marks of the examination passed / failed
 - III) Caste certificate issued by the competent authority (in case of backward class students)
 - IV) Migration certificate in case of a person who has passed the last examination from a Board other than Maharashtra State Board or a University other than Amravati University.
 - V) University Enrolment Form (for part -I students)
- 2) The program for admission for the current session shall be displayed on the Notice Board. Interview calls will not be sent
- 3) The applicants are advised to keep themselves informed of the various notices that are displayed on the notice board from time to time.
- 4) Admission is subject to the eligibility norms of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary education and Amravati University Amravati.
- 5) No application will be considered unless it fulfills the above conditions.
- 6) Applicants who have a break in education should submit a gap certificate in a form of a court affidavit stating the reason for the gap.
- 7) Duplicate TC (Transfer Certificate) will not be entertained
- 8) Admission will be provisional, subject to the approval of the University / Board and is liable to be cancelled at any time if not approved by the University / Board or if the applicant has given false information.
- 9) Reservation of seats for candidate belonging to backward class will be according to the Govt. regulation and circulars.
 - This fees is in based year 2014-15 and 10/-
 - **Note :-**As per S.G.B. Amravati University Notification No. 50/2015 dated 18/06/2015, the fees will increase 10% after every two years. This fee structure is based on the financial year 2014-15.



- 10) The admission committee will handle all matters related to admission. Applicants are required to contact this committee during working hours as displayed on the notice board.
- 11) After admission the change in subjects is not permitted.
- 12) The Principal may amend the admission rules at his discretion. The Principal's decision in all matters related to admission shall be final.

5. IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

1. Dress code: -

It is mandatory for all teaching, non-teaching staff and college students to appear in the college with the uniform chosen by the College Council Committee for the academic year. For Sr. students, (boys) pant should be gray colour and shirt sky blue. (Girls) Salwar- gray colour & Kurati - sky blue.

2. Attendance: -

In order to qualify for the Board / University examination, students must attend at least 80% of the lectures (including practicals) delivered in each subject, satisfy the college authorities regarding their general progress and measure upto the minimum standard of physical efficiency prescribed. Students enrolled in NCC and NSS shall have to put in the minimum attendance or working hours prescribed by these bodies. Students who fall short of the required attendance also do not qualify for EBC concession. Such students will have to pay full fees, as students disqualified or removed from the EBC list are not entitled to freeship. Students who fall short of attendance shall be fined. Leave of absence will be given to students at their own risk. Even a medical certificate may not condone deficiency in the percentage of attendance.

Warning: - No relaxations will be given to students for the less attendance in the classes.

3. Enrolment:

All new entrants in the senior college i.e. Part-I students will have to enroll themselves in the University. Students from other Universities or external students must also submit University Enrolment Form. The form will be supplied by the college at the time of admission. No application form will be accepted unless accompanied by the Enrolment Form A fine of Rs.50/- is imposed by the University if the Enrolment Form along with the enrolment fee does not reach the University within the prescribed time.

4. Identity card: -

A) Every bonified student of the college must have the identity card.

The identity card should be prepared from the college office by submitting a passport size photograph of the student immediately after admission on payment of Rs 10/-. The students taking admission in the subsequent academic year should get the identity card renewed within 15 days from the date of admission.



B) Students must keep the identity card with them when:

- i) They are in the premises of the college.
- ii) They are attending classes (Theory/Practical) or college functions.
- iii) They are receiving scholarships, Library Books, Money orders, registered letters, railway or bus concessions, learning/bonafide certificate, caution money or deposits or T.C. etc.
- iv) They are attending Educational Tours, Sports, Games or other activities.

C) The students will produce the Identity Card whenever it is demanded.

Any student without the Identity Card will be treated as trespasser and shall be dealt with accordingly.

5. Medical examination:

All students of the college are required to present themselves for a medical examination before a medical officer appointed by the college. Those who fail to appear for the examination are liable to appear for the university examnation.

6. Physical Training:

All undergraduate students are compulsorily required to attend the Physical Training Classes. The students who fail to attend the classes will not be liable to appear in the university examnation.

7. Students Insurance:

An insurance scheme against accidents is run in the college. The insurance is for one year. All students are compulsorily required to be registered under this scheme and to pay the premium Rs. 10/-

8. Cycle stand:

Students are directed to park their Bicycle / Vehicles at the place allotted for those purposes failing of which they will be fined. The Principal's decision in all matters of admission, administration enforcement of discipline, general rules and special instructions mentioned in this prospectus shall be "FINALAND BINDING ON ALL"

4. Other Activities: i) LIBRARY: General Rules:

- i. Students are required to have Identity card to enter the library premises.
- ii. Identity Card and Reader's Ticket are not transferable.
- iii. Students must handle the books or periodicals with a great care. Any attempt to damage books or periodicals by defacing or tearing the pages will be treated as misconduct and strictly dealt with.
- iv. If the original I-Card or Reader's ticket is lost, a duplicate will be issued on payment of Rs. 20/- each.

Study Room Rules:

- a) A complete silence and strict discipline must be maintained in the Library & Study Room.
- b) Textbooks, reference books and journals will be issued to students against I-Card. Students are not allowed to take them outside the study room.
- c) If any reference book is required, students should approach the Librarian.

Home Issue:

- a) Every student is expected to read and follow the instructions strickly given on the reverse side of the Reader's Ticket.
- b) If late in returning the books, students will have to pay a fine Rs. 1/- per day for the first week and Rs.2/- per day afterward. In case of serious default, the amount of fine may be increased up to Rs. 10/-. Per day.
- c) While charging the fine, holidays will be counted.
- d) Only textbooks will be issued for Home-Reading.
- e) Re-issue of the books will depend upon the demand for the same.

- 4) During the conduct of lectures, students should not loiter in and around the college premises.
- 5) Students should make careful use of college Books, Furniture, Laboratory equipments and the college property in general. The cost of damages of it, if any, would be recoverable from students either individually or collectively as the case may be.
- 6) Students shall not organize their own picnics, excursions, trips etc. without prior written permission of the Principal.
- 7) Smoking, Gutkha chewing and Ragging are strictly prohibited. Offenders shall be faced legal action.
- 8) Students resorting to unfair means at the exams will be dealt in accordance with the provisions of the Govt. of Maharashtra Act No.XXI of 1982 and the Maharashtra Universities Act 1994.
- 9) In order to add to the beauty of discipline, uniform is compulsory for the students and the staff. The students will be fined if they enter the college premises without college uniform.



- 10) Students are required to attend on 15th August, 26 January, Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh Jayanti and Co-curricular activities in the college premisses. Unless they will be fined.
- 11) Only special notices shall be read out in classroom. Students should see the notice board daily and keep themselves well informed about the various notices that may be put up there from time to time.
